Pupil Premium at St Anne's C of E Primary School : 2014-2015 Summary

Pupil Premium (PP) is an amount of money given to each school in England to aid the teaching and learning of pupils who are in receipt of Free School Meals. In addition a lesser amount is also given for pupils who are the children of Her Majesty's Forces personnel or are in care (i.e. looked after by the Local Authority).

The Pupil Premium of £ 33,800 was received by us in our budget for 2014-15 financial year based on an eligibility of 26 pupils.

This money was used in a variety of ways. For example: □ buying specific support and booster materials to meet the needs of the children
☐ funding towards staff to run intervention and booster sessions
□ training for staff
□ subsidising visits and residential trips.
□ enhancing and enriching the pupils' learning and development, for example training children as Young Leaders.

Our overall aim is to accelerate progress; moving the children to at least age related expectations and narrowing the gap between those children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding and other children.

In Summer 2015, this meant that 100% of PP children achieved L4+ in Reading and Maths and 50% of them achieved this in Writing, in comparison to 100% of non-PP children who achieved L4+ in Reading, Writing and Maths.

At least 3 levels of progress from Key Stage 1 were made by 100% of PP children in Reading, Writing and Maths, in comparison to 53.8% of non-PP children in Reading and Writing and to 76.9% of non-PP children in Maths.

When looking at Age Related Expectation (ARE), 58% of PP children are working at ARE, or above, in Writing. This figure increases to 67% in Reading and to 83% in Maths.
