Monday 16th November The Jesse Tree

A little different – Introduce the season of advent daily through the story of the Jesse Tree.

The Jesse Tree is a very old Christian Tradition dating back to the 11th Century. It is a fun way to trace the 'royal roots' of Jesus. Each item made traces his ancestors from Adam & Eve through the centuries to Mary and Joseph. It's called the Jesse Tree because of a verse in the Old Testament in the book of Isaiah:-

"A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of its roots" Isaiah ch 11:1

- Each day the item in brackets can be brought forward by children from a certain class to decorate the school tree. There are 17 items to go onto the tree.
- To know the story of Adam & Eve and understand temptation.
- To know Noah had hope.
- To understand the trust Abraham had.
