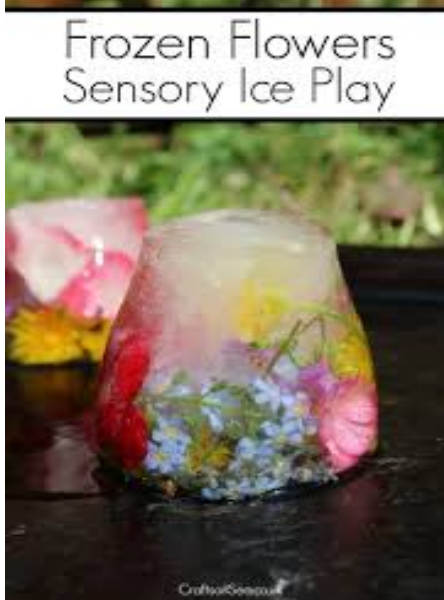


Frozen flowers sensory ice play

Can you talk to a grown up about how ice is formed? Could you add some petals or flowers to add to your mixture before you freeze it?



Nature shapes

Can you use natural materials that you find on a walk or in your back garden to make different shapes? Maybe a circle of daisies or a square made of stones?

Using paper plates write some rhyming words that will fit under two categories (eg fat, cat, mat and hen, pen, men) Get your child to throw them in to the correct circle on the ground. If you don't have any hoops you could chalk your own on the floor.

Shadow Drawing

Make the most of the sun and explore light and shadows.

Place your object of choice on your paper and use it as a guide to trace the outline.



What can you see in the clouds?
