RE Pupil Survey Outcomes

Summer 2021

- 1) Pupil responses confirm that children learn about a range of principle religions. (Christianity evident in each cohort.)
- 2) Pupil responses confirm that they learn about other people's beliefs and their own.
- 3) Pupil responses confirm that 'Big Questions' are considered. These include 'how' and 'why' questions to confirm understanding; allow the children to reflect and to consider their own questions.
- 4) Responses to question 4 indicate that children feel confident to ask questions in RE both to confirm understanding and to extend their knowledge.
- 5) From the pupil responses, it is clear that children are informed through verbal and written feedback (plus the use of reward stickers/dojos) of how well they are learning in RE.
- 6) Pupil responses indicate that a range of activities are completed in RE which they clearly enjoy! The learning of the children is extended through a range of different activities.
- 7) From responses, it is clear the different year groups have visited different places of worship either virtually or in person. Where this was not possible, pre-recorded videos have been sent to the teachers in response to pupil questions.
- 8) Responses confirm that RE helps the children learn about beliefs of others around the world; deepening understanding and modelling respect and tolerance.
- 9) The children clearly enjoy learning from visits and visitors in RE and would like more. Their learning has encouraged a desire to learn about other religions and beliefs. They also enjoy art and drama activities and would like more.
- 10) Responses include that RE is fun, interesting and enjoyable.
