As part of our Geography work on rivers, we studied the River Gaunless which is a tributary to the River Wear. Jack and Phillip from the River Wear Trust met us and guided us throughout the day. We participated in a Kick test sample and studied the variety of river wildlife including Mayflies, freshwater shrimps, bullheads and leeches. Later we looked at the many different plants that can be found on a river banks including the harmful Himalayan Balsam. After an eagerly anticipated lunch, we enjoyed a walk through the park looking at the river features and we enjoyed seeing the sheep and lambs. Best of all we were allowed to play safely in Coundon Burn another tributary of the Wear. Eventually, exhausted yet full of learning, we returned to St Anne's. The children were well mannered, enthusiastic and resilient throughout the day. Well done everyone and a massive thank you to our parents for all of the extra clothing, packed lunches and support to enable our successful trip.






































St Anne's CE Primary School calls out for votes to get a share of Tesco's Stronger Starts fund

St Anne's is bidding for a cash boost from the Tesco Stronger Starts scheme. Stronger Starts provides grant awards of up to £1,500 to local community projects, with a particular focus on children and young people. Three groups in every community have been shortlisted to receive grant awards and Tesco customers can vote for the group they think should take away the top award in their local Tesco store. St Anne's is one of the groups on the shortlist in Bishop Auckland.

Children with enough food have more energy, better concentration, and ultimately achieve more too."

Graham Duxbury, Groundwork's UK Chief Executive, said: "As a community charity, we have seen first-hand how schools and other groups supporting young people have been playing a much bigger role in ensuring children are getting a healthy start to the day and getting access to spaces and services to support physical activity and mental health. Family budgets are tight and school budgets are tight, but it's so important that children stay fed, fit and focused, so we're delighted to be able to prioritise these activities alongside Tesco with the Stronger Starts programme."

Funding is available to community groups and charities looking to fund local projects that bring benefits to communities, particularly those helping to provide food and giving children the support, they need for a good start in life.
