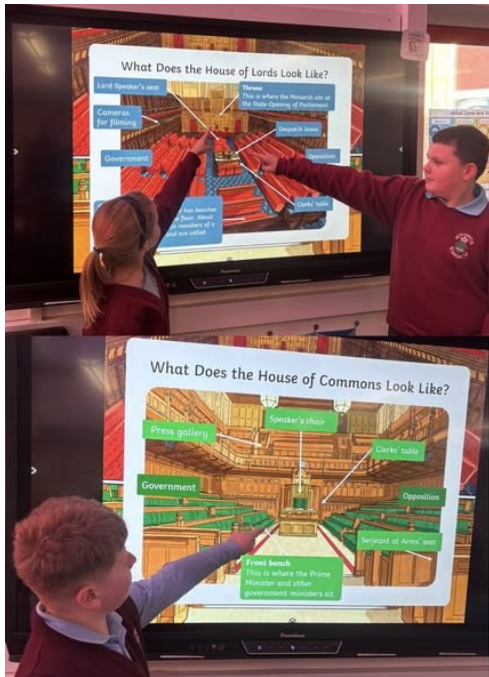

The class worked together to create a class wormery. They carefully layered soil, sand and leaves then gently introduced their wriggly visitors. Over the next few weeks we will observe how the worms mix the layers and help enrich the soil.

Our learning adventure continued outdoors with an exciting mini-beast hunt. The children recorded what they found and discussed their findings with their peers. Great work Year 2!

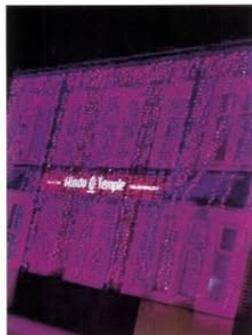

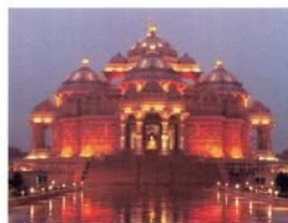

As a result, we have been allocated a Financial Inclusion Support Officer, Julia Waterhouse, who can offer advice and support with any financial concerns. She can also offer full welfare benefit checks and assist with applying for welfare benefits, disability benefits and grants.

Accessing this provision is completely confidential. If you would like your details passing on, we can do this on your behalf. Are you missing out on Universal Credit?

Universal Credit can be paid to working and non working families

There will no longer be an earnings threshold if working and claiming Universal Credit

ALL families in receipt of Universal Credit will be eligible for Free School Meals from September 2026

By claiming Free School Meals this could save you £490 per year per child

Julia would like to make all parents and carers aware that the government are changing the eligibility criteria for free school meals in September 2026. This means that every family receiving Universal Credit will now qualify for free school meals.
